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## Wedding registry tips

Building a wedding registry is a task unlike any other couples may encounter during their lifetimes. Wedding registries are invaluable resources that provide engaged couples' loved ones with gift suggestions. In spite of that value, couples may find it daunting and even a little uncomfortable to build their wedding registries.

Building a wedding registry can feel like walking a tightrope.

Couples likely won't want to ask for too much or for gifts that are too expensive, but a poorly built registry can be a major inconvenience for guests. The following tips can help couples build adequate registries that benefit them without asking too much of their guests.

• Register with more than one store. It's important to register with

more than one store. Doing so makes things as convenient as possible for guests and increases the chances they will be able to shop at stores they're familiar with. Unless your guest list is predominantly local, try to register with at least one national chain so guests who live in different regions can shop for gifts in-person if they prefer to do so.

- Make a large list. Some couples are hesitant to make large wedding registries, feeling that doing so gives the impression that they're asking for too much. But large registries simply give guests more options to choose from. Many industry insiders advise registering for two to three gifts per guest. That might seem like a lot, but guests will appreciate having all of those options.
  - Don't hesitate to include expen-

sive items on your registry. Couples also may be hesitant to include especially expensive items on their wedding registries. However, the couples' parents and other close relatives may be honored to purchase more expensive items, so couples should not feel embarrassed to include them on their lists. It's also important to note that many retailers, after couples' wedding days have come and gone, discount registry items that weren't purchased. So even if no one purchases the more expensive items, including them on a registry may significantly reduce their cost for couples who want to buy such items themselves after tying the knot.

• Vary the prices of items on the list. In addition to including more expensive items on the registry, make sure to include moderately

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priced and inexpensive items. This gives guests more options and ensures guests who might be spending a lot to travel to and from the wedding can still purchase gifts without digging too much deeper into their pockets.

• Periodically update the registries. Periodically update your registries to remove items you have already received and to add items if many of the less expensive ones have already been purchased. This also makes things more convenient for guests.

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### Ross Station prepares for second season of weddings

Ross Station at the Governor Ross Plantation in Seaford is ready for its second season of weddings, parties and corporate events. The 6,000-foot facility opened last spring on the grounds of the Italianate mansion built in the 1850s by William Henry Harrison Ross, once governor of Delaware, near the railroad tracks, which he helped bring to southern Delaware.

A historical landmark, Ross Plantation is perfect for couples looking for an idyllic setting to inspire lifelong wedding memories. Twenty acres of what was once an 800-acre plantation remain in scenic, rolling countryside surround the mansion and various outbuildings, including a barn, honeymoon cottage and former slave quarters.

The exterior of Ross Station is designed to resemble a railroad station, and a railroad crossing sign stands near the entrance. The interior

is modern and bright. Wooden beams and trim are crafted from locally sourced cypress. The ballroom, "Heyssel Hall," can accommodate up to 230 guests for a seated meal with room for DJ and a dance floor, or more than 300 for auditorium style seating. Tables, chairs and linens are included in all rentals. The facility is wired for sound throughout, with video projection available in the main hall and the multipurpose room. The latter room, just inside the entrance, can be screened off to create a private space for a bridal party.


The Historical Society maintains an open-door policy, allowing your choice of vendors. A caterer's kitchen with two large refrigerators and a pass-through window makes food service a breeze. Clean, modern, wheelchair-accessible restrooms are conveniently located and there is plenty of parking on-site or nearby.


Need more space? There is plenty of room on the sprawling grounds to

erect a tent, allowing a view of the mansion, the pecan grove and barns beyond. Weather permitting, outdoor parties can take place beneath the huge trees or on the patio of the beautifully refurbished mansion. If you prefer a more intimate setting, check out mansion's Main Parlor.

Ross Station is owned and operated by the nonprofit Seaford Historical Society and all proceeds go to preserve the mansion and grounds, as well as the Seaford Museum downtown. Construction of Ross Station was funded by grants and donations, so it is mortgage free. Thus, rentals are priced competitively.





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# Barn at Vanderwende Acres offers old, new wedding setting

What's old and new and a perfect wedding venue? A former dairy barn at Vanderwende Acres in Seaford has been transformed, with a lot of love and attention, into a rustic but elegant place to hold a wedding or big party. Surrounded by picturesque open farm fields, you and your guests can dance the night away on a fire-lit patio or relax in a beautiful pavilion as the sun sets over the round roof of the barn.

The historic facility at 22304 Atlanta Road was a working dairy farm as early as the 1930s until the 1980s, and touches of that history remain. Inside the remodeled structure, stanchions where cows were once milked have been removed

from one side. They remain on the other side, with the long feeding trough turned into a photo gallery. A new floor, walls and stairs were added; curtains and lights were hung. The wooden ceiling was whitewashed and tall oak barrels were turned into tables.

The barn has separate groom's room and bride's quarters where wedding party members can prepare for the ceremony. The huge second floor, formerly the hay loft, is ideal for photographs. Brides may choose to use the balcony and outside staircase to float down like a princess at a ball, meeting her father at the bottom to be escorted down the aisle.

Outside, a beautiful stone patio was added, complete with an enormous stone fireplace which can serve

as a backdrop when the bride and groom exchange their vows. A fire pit encircled by a stone wall suitable for seating adds to the ambiance. An adjacent covered pavilion provides additional space for a reception or seated dinner. Tables and chairs are provided. Inside the barn, there is seating for 110; outside spaces will accommodate 250.

A farm shed offers private space for vendors to make final preparations indoors.

There is plenty of parking space. The beautifully landscaped venue abuts what is a true working grain farm. The cows are long gone!

Wedding rentals include exclusive use of the property for a 14-hour day.
